A Word from the Pastor – “A Movement”

Our Lay Delegate Patti Crego and I just returned from our Annual Conference, which was held on the beautiful campus of Mount Vernon Nazarene University. There was much great learning and fellowship! One of the things that caught my attention was instead of saying “our new denomination”, many of the speakers said, “our Movement” or “this Movement”. It got me to thinking “how are we a movement of the Lord Jesus Christ?”

The reality is God is a God who is on the move. We can see as we read through the book of Acts that God was on the move. Jesus sets this Movement in motion by declaring to His followers right before His ascension to the Father, “you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth” (Acts 1:8). God’s Movement will be ever-increasing and expanding, and just as Jesus said it, so it occurred from Pentecost all throughout the book of Acts and continues to this day.

So, it begs the question, “are we a part of the Movement of God?” I believe the Global Methodist Church is positioning in such a way as to not just be another denomination, but to be a Movement of God, a culture changing Movement. We want to be alive in God’s Spirit so that we are always positioned to be outward reaching. Each local church in the GMC is being challenged to start at least one new local church, be outward focused in our missions to others locally, beyond our community, and even to the other side of the planet, and to grow in our discipleship so that we are truly disciples making disciples that make disciples. We see this impetus in our mission statement “to make disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly.” God is on the move!

So, how do we do that personally? Jesus gives the formula: be alive in Him. “I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, then you will produce much fruit. Without me, you can’t do anything” (John 15:5). Healthy organisms and systems produce good fruit. Much has been planted this Spring, and now as the plants are nourished and cared for, whether in the fields or gardens, we hope and trust for a bountiful harvest. In the same way, as we care for our lives, connecting ourselves fully to Jesus, realizing we have no other source, He makes our lives fully alive in Him so that we are ready to allow that passionate worship to lead us to extravagant love and bold witness.

Our alive faith, not only individually, but corporately, helps us to spur one another on in the faith in our corporate worship, small groups, committees, learning, missions, evangelizing, and working together in the body of Christ for the betterment of those outside the church. Connected together, and not just a lone plant, helps us to see the power of working together. One plus one in the Kingdom of God equals three (or more).

So, what are you doing to enliven your faith each day? How are you leaning into that prayer “give us today our daily bread?” This fallen world is a battle each day between good and evil. As we are pressing into God fervently, we recognize the challenge to truly “remain in”

Jesus. So many beliefs, urges, and distractions from within and without are fighting against us. But as we set forth daily disciplines in our lives and being close with other believers, we shall see a movement, God's Movement, rising up within us and our churches, for God is always stronger than the opposition, Light is always stronger than the darkness. May these growing months of Summer truly be growing months for each one of us in God's Movement!

Allegheny West Annual Conference

The 2nd Allegheny West Annual Conference was held May 22-25, this one at Mount Vernon Nazarene University. Many wonderful times of teaching, preaching, and sessions were enjoyed by all. See recordings of these events at the conference website alleghenywestgmc.org. One of the many blessings of the conference was the beginning of the relationship with the Kenya-Ethiopia GMC Conference. A goal of \$150k was set to provide education and transportation for pastors and leadership for Kenya-Ethiopia. \$164k was received in the Miracle Offering on the Thursday evening worship service with an additional \$57k pledged for a total of \$221k to date! We look forward to a minimum of a Five-year relationship between the conferences, and we are praying, seeking God to consider a circuit-to-circuit relationship between the Columbus West Circuit, of which we are a part, and the Zanesville Circuit with the Nairobi Circuit in Kenya. In this type of relationship there may be physical needs we can help with, but also gaining many spiritual blessings and a rich relationship with our African brothers and sisters in the Lord. October 21 – November 1 this year there will be a delegation from our Conference going to Kenya. Pray about if you would like to be a part of that group; the cost is \$3100.

Our Annual Conference for next year is scheduled for June 18-21, once again at Mount Vernon Nazarene University. Pray about attending the conference as a delegate or as a guest where you can stay on campus in dorms and/or eat meals in the dining hall, all for a reasonable price. The goal of the conference, as it was this year, is to have minimal business sessions and more great teaching, preaching, and worship as we continue to seek the Lord in this new Movement!

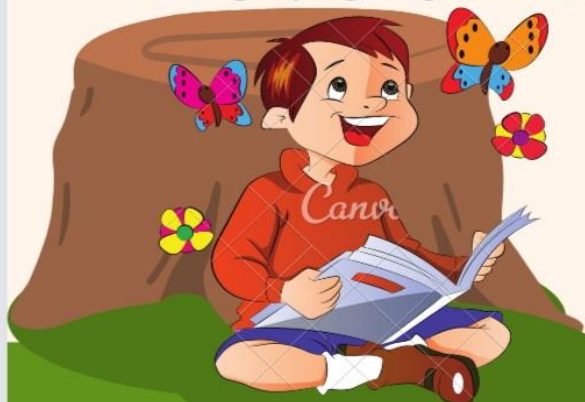
