<u>A Word from the Pastor – "Praying for Impact"</u>

Prayer is the most valuable tool we have (not to diminish Scripture, for that is our guide and rule, and we can pray the scriptures, as well as read and search the scriptures to pray rightly). Many times it has been said "prayer changes things." The critical element in prayer is that we have the opportunity to connect with our heavenly Father. We get caught in going down a prayer list, and it's okay to prayer for others. We are certainly called to do that, but maybe the order should be different. Prayer, first and foremost, is drawing into the holy place, into connection with God.

Connection with God, isn't that the goal, to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength? God is always present, but are we attuned to Him, aligned with Him, centering our minds on Him, and seeing Him enter us and transform us? That's His desire, communion with Him. And when we get into that zone, God is impacting us; He is changing us, from glory to glory He's changing us (2 Cor. 3:18).

And that is the sweet spot, the place to be fully surrendered to whatever He wants to do, not what we have on our agenda. And the beautiful thing is that in that surrender, we can just rest in Him by faith knowing that He is there, whether we are feeling anything or not, because He promises to be there ("He will never leave us or forsake us" Hebrews 13:5 and Deuteronomy 31:6). Rest, knowing by faith God is right there with you. And it is good to be in His presence, knowing that then He is doing His work in us. As we are surrendered to Him, He does the heavy lifting.

In this way of God impacting us, He wants that embrace to lead us to a "praying for impact." In the glory of His presence, in the trusting that He is right with us, He wants to open up a way of impact. Are we ready to go that step with Him? Do we believe that He wants to make a difference? Did you know the God of the universe wants to work through us to others? This too takes faith, but God clearly calls us to "make disciples." So, how are we going to do that?

We start with believing, believing that God is making us a disciple. We are learning to follow Him, which takes surrender ("not my will, but Yours be done"). We train ourselves to follow Jesus. Physical training takes discipline, and spiritual training takes learning daily commitment. Paul says, "I discipline my body like an athlete, training it to do what it should" (1 Cor. 9:27 NLT). A big part of this discipline is calling on the Holy Spirit to fill us and help us in these steps of discipline.

As we are surrendered and being changed ("transformed" Romans 12:2), God is ready to use us, to make a difference, make an impact toward others. Sometimes we have to start with the end in view. Are you ready to pray for impact? Do you believe, do I believe, that we can make a difference for others? What things is God calling us to do to walk in this way of impact? What might He call us to say or do that will make a difference for others? If we want to see the change, we have to be the change. The power of God, the love of God is ready to flow through us because God wants to make a difference, and He wants to do it through people. So, why not start with us?

I'm ready to see people come to Jesus. How about you? How can we be praying for impact so we can see this happen? It's God's desire "that no one should perish" (2 Peter 3:9), and Jesus said, "the fields are already ripe for the harvest" (John 4:35) and "plead with the Lord of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest" (Matthew 9:38). So, God is ready to do it now. Let's pray for impact, and let's pray the love of God would fill us to love others in God's pure love that shares the Good News with them and allows the Holy Spirit to beckon them to come to Jesus. Let us see the harvest, let us see the impact!



Dear Readers, Trustees have a question for you???????

Before we ask a trustee question of our readers, first we have a couple of significant updates to share.

The first item is ongoing improvements including the front steps and railing. Pictured is Harv Crego (Trustee helper) standing by his handy work of an all-new custom metal railing by the front door. Also, much needed new six-inch gutter and down spout have been installed to better manage the drainage away from the church foundation.

The second item to report is a list of projects completed since April 2023. There are more items but this gives you an idea of the work accomplished.

- New water softener system with rust removal
- Disconnect electric from house/annex
- Asbestos professionally removed from house/annex. Approved by EPA
- New underground electric from church, to garage, to barn
- New front digital sign with Global Methodist logo
- Roof cleaned and sealed
- Old plastic goal posts removed. Old telephone/light poles removed. Old satellite dish removed
- Dead pine tree removed
- Garage with updated power. New garage door. Power washed inside. Available for storage
- Brush along creek mowed
- New kids' playset installed

Significant to add is the gratitude and appreciation for the continued generosity of giving and prayerful consideration to the requests and efforts that makes all this work possible.

Now for the question to our readers...

One of the trustees' big "to do" items is the demolition of the house/annex. The house was determined inhabitable due to termite destruction. Initial plans were to use the house as a burn for fire department training. However, the EPA denied permission on a controlled burn. Our second option is to raze or demolish the house, remove the debris and return the site to grassed yard area. Here is our dilemma. To have professionally done would be in the estimated amount of \$10,000 to \$13,000. This can be done privately versus by a professional company. Our goal is to work toward removal over the upcoming year. But, required is that it is done safely and thoroughly.

If you have any ideas or recommendations on who and how to accomplish this work, please contact one of the trustees. We welcome your input.
