A Word from the Pastor - "Every Moment, Every Thought Is a Choice"

Last month I shared about every day to us is Easter, and the power that raised Jesus from the dead is available to us as well; God loves to share who He is and what He is! Continuing with this theme of every day, every moment is a choice for us. And every moment relates to every thought. So, you might say God is pro-choice. In fact, He is, not that He agrees with children being killed in the womb, but He does give us free will; He will never force His will on us.

God gives us this free will because of love. A loving parent at times stands back and allows their child to make decisions at the proper time and in the proper context. Love helps them to grow and learn. In the same way, God allows us to make our choices. Now, just like children (and like my dad used to say), you can chalk that up to a learning experience. And when free will chooses God, then the love of God invades them, gladly comes in to us in the degree that we allow. And God smiles brightly, rejoicing in His children just like an earthly parent would do.

In this vein of free will, and all the time, we get to choose. Right before Moses declaring his death was at hand, he shared with Israel, "Look here! Today I've set before you life and what's good versus death and what's wrong" (Deuteronomy 30:15). Moses was ready to meet God just as he had repeatedly on earth. Every choice is a choice between life and death, between God's desires and what we want. Joshua at the end of his book said, "but if it seems wrong in your opinion to serve the LORD, then choose today whom you will serve. Choose the gods whom your ancestors served...but my family and I will serve the LORD" (Joshua 24:15). Praise God! Choosing God brings life! Joshua was ready to meet God.

Paul takes the choice to the thought level in 2 Corinthians 10:5: "capture every thought to make it obedient to Christ." That's a good question to ask; it clears the air of confusion and makes it crystal clear: is this thought in line with Jesus and who He is? We start our renewed walk with the Lord with a thought, that adds to another thought, and so on. We are all in a battle, the battle between good and evil. Every day, every moment, every thought we are in a battle. It is called the battlefield of the mind. Will "we have the mind of Christ" (1 Corinthians 2:16)?

Here's one more verse from 1st Corinthians that offers three great promises from God (10:13): 1. "No temptation has seized you that isn't common for people." 2. "But God is faithful. He won't allow you to be tempted beyond your abilities." And 3. "Instead, with the temptation, God will also supply a way out so that you will be able to endure it." God is ready to help us with every challenge, every thought.

Kingdom living is about living into this mindset that Paul had. We see the fierce obstacles he overcame, and great advancements for the Kingdom of God, probably the greatest evangelist the world has ever known. "Let us throw off any extra baggage, get rid of the sin that trips us up, and fix our eyes on Jesus, faith's pioneer and perfecter" (Hebrews 12:1b-2a). In other words, step out of the boat knowing God's got you, and see what He will do as we lean into Him in every moment and every thought. Let us trust Him - He is good!

100 Years! 1924 - 2024

The Sewing Guilds of Ohio Health Riverside Methodist Hospital

Anniversary Celebration Luncheon was held April 22, 2024

Sewing Guild # 11 was honored to be a part of this 100 year Celebration at the Wesley Glen Retirement Center in Columbus. Dr. Marian Kennedy Schuda, MD, Medical Director of Patient Services, OhioHealth Riverside Methodist Hospital gave a brief history of the forming of the Sewing Guild.

The Sewing Guild originally began at the White Cross Hospital in April 1924 by The United Methodist Women of the time to make items in caring for the patients and to provide items for the medical field. The United Methodist ladies were to be approved and recommended to be of righteous living and moral by their Pastor's to be part of the group. This was the beginning of the volunteer program at the hospital. Interesting note-early in the history of the hospital the Ladies raised \$6000 to help keep the hospital afloat financially. The White Cross Hospital eventually became the Riverside Methodist Hospital in 1961 at the present location on Olentangy River Road in Columbus.

At present, the 7 Sewing Guilds create items for the comfort of the patients with 106 members who donate hours of time and love for the care of the patients.

SEWING GUILD # 11 was organized in 1978 by Anne Reese and Joan Prindle at the Commercial Point UM Church, now the Global Methodist on Main Church.

Proudly, Jackie Writsel and Betty Drake co-chaired Guild #11 for 30 years until covid stopped the Sewing Guilds from meeting for a time. Some of the members in Columbus area were charged to make the first masks, in their homes to help protect from covid at the hospital. Jackie served as Vice-President and Membership chair for several years and Betty served as treasurer for the group for several years.

At present, Sheila Writsel and Sherry Albright serve as co-chairs of our local group with 17 total members that are active. Last year, our small group turned in 1808 items for 7553 hours of work and love. We are proud of that accomplishment. Service Pins were awarded to Sheila Writsel-30 years, Sherry Albright-5 years, Sherry Williams-5 years, Jan Covault-5 years.


